TOPIC FOCUS: ENOUGH FOR EVERYONE

In this fascinating topic, the children will learn about the needs of a settlement and the planet as a whole. The children will also find out where resources, such as power and food, come from and look at ways in which natural resources can be conserved. They will also consider how their actions impact on others around the world and how they can make changes to ensure that there is enough for everyone. In Science the children will learn about space and the planetary bodies in our solar system. The children will learn about the movement of the planets, their relative sizes and distance from the sun. During this half term, the children will use textile artist Karen Rose as inspiration for their art unit. In computing, they will be listening to and creating their very own podcasts.

English

To begin our English this half term, we will explore a wonderful book called 'In our Hands' by Lucy Farfort. The narrative is told through the eyes of a young girl, who is determined to grow a seed of hope that will inspire everyone to come together and build a better future. Our aim is to reconnect after the summer break, fostering togetherness as a whole school community.

This unit will be followed up by 'Cosmic' by Frank Cottrell Boyce, which is linked to our Space topic. The children will learn about how an author's use of language, structure and illustrations can affect the reader. We will also write a letter from a character's perspective and a diary entry in role. In our biographies unit, we will write a biography of an inspirational female scientist, Katherine Johnson.

Maths

We are continuing our mastery approach to maths, whereby we spend longer on topics so that the children gain a deeper understanding of mathematical concepts. This half term, the children will be furthering their understanding of the following topics:

- Place value
- Addition and subtraction
- Multiplication and division

We are really concentrating on our times tables this term to ensure that ALL children can recall up to 12x12 times tables rapidly. This term we are focusing on the 4x and 8x tables. Please help your children practise these at home.

ONLINE SAFETY

Please remind your child of e-safety whenever they use the internet and other electronic devices such as mobile phones. We encourage you to regularly monitor their use and ensure parental controls are in place.

If you would like any further advice on esafety, please feel free to speak to any of the teachers and we will be happy to help you.

HOME LEARNING

Project Homework: Children will have their homework sent out electronically on Showbie with a due date for each piece of home learning. Homework should be sent back through photographs via Showbie and children are also encouraged to bring their homework into school.

Spelling: Spellings must be practised often. Please encourage your child to use the online platform - Spelling Shed to practise their spellings. A paper copy of the spelling list will also go home weekly and will be tested weekly as well. You can also find a copy of the Year 5 statutory spelling words attached to this term's homework.

Times Table Rock Stars: Please continue to encourage your child to practise their times tables through the use of Times Table Rock Stars! We are really working on improving the children's speed and accuracy in their times tables so we encourage all children to spend 10 minutes a day on this at home.

Reading: In addition, your child should practise reading every day and record this in their Reading Champions book. The children will go home with both their book banded book and a novel of their choice. Your child also has access to the e-library called SORA. They can log in using their Showbie log in details to read e-books online from home.
