

GROUPS

In order to support learning, pupils may be taught in groups for maths and reading. Additional small group teaching will take place as needed to support your child's progress.



Maths

In our Maths lessons, we will work on a broad range of skills with a particular focus on arithmetic. We will continue to use mental and written methods for all four operations. In the first few weeks, much of our learning will be focussed on number and place value.

The children will also be learning about real-life applications of mathematics through problem-solving activities related to different industries.

We are particularly concentrating on our times tables this term to ensure that ALL children can recall up to 12x12 times tables rapidly.

Please practise these at home daily using the <u>Times Tables Rock Stars app.</u> This is a fun and engaging way for your child to practice.

HOME LEARNING

Project homework will be sent via Showbie.

Spellings will be given out weekly on Mondays; children will be tested the following Monday. The spellings can be found on <u>Spelling Shed</u> - a great website/app that will aid your child's learning.



Please continue to encourage your child to read often and record this in their Reading Champions book. The children will go home with both their assessed book banded book and a novel of their choice.

Times tables is a key focus for Year 6; please continue to practise these regularly. Children should use <u>Times Tables Rock Stars</u> every day.
