TOPIC FOCUS: OUR LOCAL COMMUNITY

We have planned lots of exciting learning opportunities for the children to learn and investigate. We will be reading a range of fiction and non-fiction books related to our topic. The children will also continue with their phonics learning and applying this to their reading and writing. In mathematics we will be counting the total number of objects in two sets, comparing two sets of objects, subtilising to 4 and learning about 2D shapes.

RECEPTION AUTUMN 2 2023

Home Learning

WB 30th October:

Core Book - All are Welcome Here

- Count actions on your way to school, such as the number of steps you take, or hops you do.
- Create your own map of your route to school.
- Practice writing your name.

WB: 6th November:

Core Book - Emergency!

- Draw a picture of what you might want to be when you grow up.
- Visit the library and look at non-fiction books about jobs in our local community, such as librarian, police officer, lollipop person, etc.
- Practice writing our graphemes of the week: v, w, x, y.

WB: 13th November:

Core Book - What a Wonderful World

- Go on a phonics hunt looking for objects with the qu and sh sound in them.
- Design your own nature picture using natural materials from outside.
- Draw a picture of what makes you feel happy.

WB: 20th November:

Core Book - Mr Gumpy's Outing

- Draw a map of your route to school.
- Create a boat using materials at home. Test it in the bathtub with an adult and see if it will it sink or float?
- Practice writing the tricky words I, is, the, go, no, into

WB: 27th November:

Core Book - If the Dinosaurs Came Back

- Can you find out information about dinosaurs?
 Ask an adult to help you look in some books or on a website.
- How many hops can you do? Count them! What about how many star jumps?

WB:4th December:

Core Book - Stickman

- Create your own stick person.
- Go on a tricky word hunt. Look for I, the, is
- Find 2-3 objects in your house and order them by their weight.

WB: 11th & 18th December:

Core Book - A Very Snowy Christmas

- Think about winter and the type of changes that happen. Create a fact file about winter.
- Design your own snowy art scene.
- Write about your favourite celebration with your family.
