TOPIC FOCUS: THE MAJESTIC MAYANS!

English

This half term, we will be studying the text 'The Last Wild' by Piers Torday. The children will engage in discussions, which will include raising questions and debating ideas. They will write in a variety of forms including a newspaper front page and a poem. To end the unit, the children will write their very own ending for the text.

Maths

This half term, the children will further their understanding of multiplication and division. They will practise their fluency, problem solving and reasoning in a range of areas such as prime numbers, multiples, factors, cube and square numbers.

This term we will be concentrating on the 3x and the 6x times tables. Please practice these at home.

We do not recommend that children under the age of ten walk home alone. However you must sign and return a school form if you would like them to. Please ask the office or your child's teacher for more details.

HOME LEARNING

Project Homework: Children will have their homework sent out electronically on Showbie with a due date for each piece of home learning. Homework should be sent back through photographs via Showbie and children are also encouraged to bring it into school.

Spelling: Spellings must be practised often. Please encourage your child to use the new online platform - Spelling Shed - to practise their spellings. A paper copy will also go home weekly. Spellings will be tested weekly.

Times Table Rock Stars: Please continue to encourage your child to practise their times tables through the use of Times Table Rock Stars! We are really working on improving the children's speed and accuracy in their times tables so we encourage all children to spend 10 minutes a day on this at home.

Reading: In addition, your child should practise reading every day and record this in their Reading Champions book. The children will go home with both their book banded book and a novel of their choice. Your child also has access to the e-library called SORA. They can log in using their Showbie log in details to read e-books online from home.
