YEAR 6 NEWSLETTER AUTUMN 2

English

In English, we will be reading 'Goodnight Mister Tom,' by Michelle Magorian. In the story, the main character (Will) is evacuated to the countryside and looked after by Mister Tom. We will empathise with Will and write a postcard home to his mum as well as understanding the character of Will's mother by writing a letter. Later in the topic, we will be planning and re-

writing a chapter from a different character's perspective.

In addition, we will also research Britain's Black Airmen and write a biography about a heroic pilot that helped in the war.





In our maths lessons, we will continue to build on our arithmetic skills, using mental and written methods for all four operations. We will learn to add, subtract and simplify fractions and solve fraction problems. After learning how to find percentages of numbers, we will solve real-life problems using this skill. We will also be further developing our understanding of decimals and solving calculations involving these.

Please encourage children to practise their timetables at home daily using the Times Tables Rock Stars app. This is a fun and engaging way for your child to practice. Mathletics is also a useful website for children to practise their reasoning skills.

GROUPS

In order to support learning, pupils may be taught in groups for maths and reading. Additional small group teaching will take place as needed to support your child's progress.

HOME LEARNING

Project homework will be sent via Showbie.

Spellings will be given out weekly on Mondays; children will be tested the following Monday. The spellings can be found on <u>Spelling Shed</u> - a great website/app that will aid your child's learning as well as on Showbie.



Please continue to encourage your child to read often and record this in their Reading Champions book. The children will go home with both their assessed book banded book and a novel of their choice.

Times tables is a key focus for Year 6; please continue to practise these regularly. Children should use Times Tables Rock Stars daily for 15 minutes.
