TOPIC FOCUS: EXPLORERS

We have planned lots of exciting learning opportunities for the children to explore and investigate within their natural environment. We will be reading a range of fiction and non-fiction books related to our topic and the children will also be given opportunities to investigate and use natural materials from the environment to produce creative work. The children will continue with their phonics learning and we will focus on enabling them to apply their phonic knowledge to developing their reading and writing skills. In mathematics we will be focusing on number recognition, comparing two sets of objects, adding, subitising and partitioning numbers ie. 5 and 3 makes up 8. The children will also learn about weight, length and positional language.

Home Learning

WB:19th February

Core Book - Going On A Bear Hunt

- Counting 1:1, combining shapes to make new shapes and pictures.
- Create a map of the local area.

WB: 26th February:

Core Book -Farmer Duck

- Comparison, exploring triangles. How many shapes can you make using different types of triangles?
- Sponge printing of flowers. Natural materials collage.

WB: 4th March

Core Book - Sam Plants a Sunflower

- Composition of numbers, measure and compare objects by heights and weights.
- Consider growing plants, explore nature areas.
- Hand print flowers.

WB: 11th March

Core Book - The Little Gardener

- Composition of numbers, measuring and comparing objects by length.
- Clear and tidy nature area, still life rubbings of natural textures.

LITTLE WANDLE LETTERS & SOUNDS

WB: 18th March

Core Book - Oliver's Vegetables

- Composition of numbers, measuring and comparing objects by weight.
- Vegetable tasting, vegetable sculpting, creating healthy food plates.

WB: 25th March

Core Book - How Do Flowers Grow?

- Can you find out about how flowers grow? Ask an adult to help you look in some books or on a website for information.
- Do a flower classification chart, make lollipop stick flowers.
- Maths-review week, using positional language eg. Above, below, beside etc.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Please ensure your child is bringing their book bag to school everyday. Books will be changed once a week but Phonics books will be collected on Mondays to be used in school throughout the week. Children should not bring other bags to school, other than their Heronsgate book bag. P.E. kits should also be brought into school on Mondays and left at school until PE day.

Thank you for helping your child with their phonics over the half term break. We hope that the weekly home learning material on Tapestry has beefed useful in supporting your child to identify the graphemes we have been learning and practice writing the graphemes and reading words spelt with them .
