Reminders

TOPIC FOCUS: 'A TOY STORY'

Our topic this half term is 'A Toy Story'. We will be learning all about toys from the past to the present day. In Computing, we will be learning about code and how we can use it to perform actions using a Beebot and on an app called Beebots. In Design and Technology we will be using levers and sliders to make moving toys. In Science, we will be learning about common plants and how plants grow from seeds. We will also be looking at different types of trees.

English

In English we will be learning about the traditional tale 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'. We will be exploring the setting, plot and characters in the story through drama and retelling activities. This will lead into us planning and writing our own story based on The Three Billy Goats Gruff that is based in the city. We also be reading a modern version of Goldilocks called 'Ghanaian Goldilocks'. We learn all about Ghanaian culture, write information pages and write our very own Goldilocks story.

Maths

In Maths this half term, we will be exploring number place value within 50. Then, we will move onto exploring length and height followed by weight and mass. As part of our learning, we will explore these concepts and learn to make comparisons.

ONLINE SAFETY

Talk to your child about how the Internet can be used to find information- you can use it to find out about pretty much anything! Explain to your child that it can sometimes be dangerous and we need to make sure we know how to stay safe on the Internet.



HOME LEARNING

We encourage you to read with your child **every day** for 10 - 15 minutes and make comments in their blue Reading Champions books. Books will be changed weekly.

There are lots of rewards for reading books at home so please do encourage your child to read as much as possible!

Please ensure your children practise their number facts daily using Numbots! They will get certificates in school for the levels they achieve on the app.
